


How to make THE PERFECT PAPER AIRPLANE

Tips


- Make sure your fold is exactly where you want it to be and all the edges are lined up before you press the crease in.
- Once you have made a fold, press it down to make the crease nice and sharp. A crisp, tight crease will help make the next fold easier to do.
- Both sides of the plane need to be identical if it is going to fly straight.
- Once you have made your perfect paper airplane, you can decorate and customize it.




Take a piece of rectangular paper. Standard 8½ x 11" printer/copier paper is a great choice.




Fold it in half lengthwise and press down to make a sharp crease. Then unfold it so the sharp edge of the crease faces up.




Fold the upper right corner down to make a triangle with the edge right on the centre crease.




Fold the upper left corner to match.




Fold the right corner into the centre crease again.



Fold the left corner to match.



Fold the right corner into the centre crease one last time.



Fold the left corner in to match.

DER AIRPLANA



Turn the plane over and fold back along the centre crease so that one wing sits on top of the other.



While holding on to the centre crease, angle the wings upward – and your airplane is ready to go!
